

DOGGIE, DOGGIE, WHERE'S YOUR BONE?

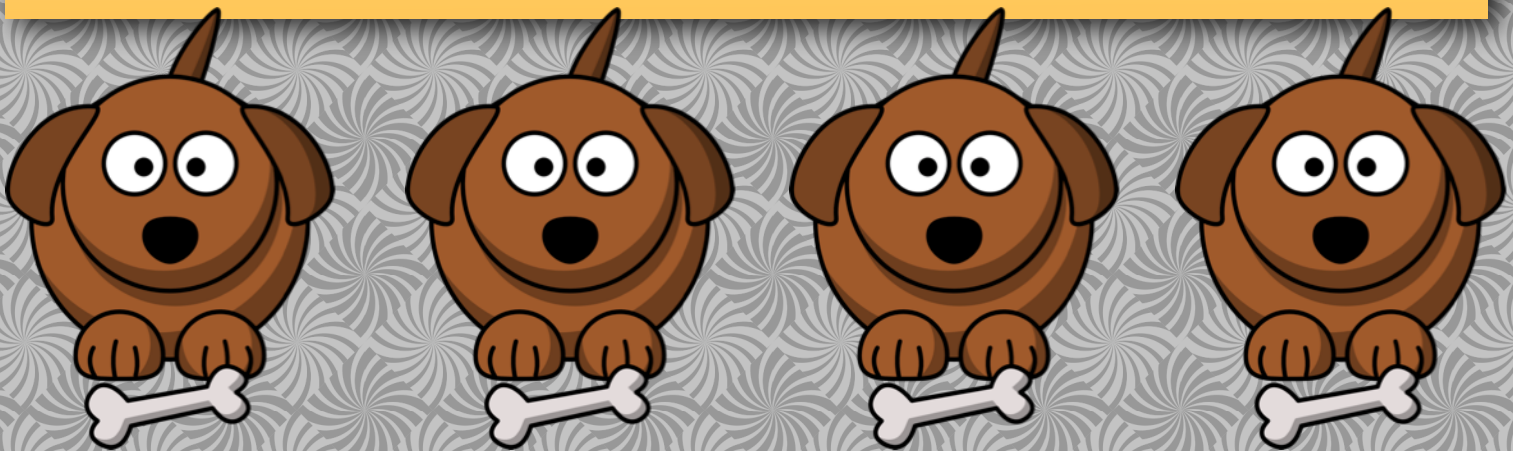
ICEBREAKER ACTIVITY

EQUIPMENT

ERASER OR A SMALL OBJECT.

INSTRUCTIONS

START WITH TWO STUDENTS IN FRONT OF THE ROOM - USUALLY ONE IS SITTING WHILE THE OTHER IS STANDING. THE ONE SITTING CLOSES HIS/HER EYES WITH THEIR BACK TO THE REST OF THE CLASS. THE ONE STANDING TAKES AN ERASER (OR ANY OTHER DESIGNATED OBJECT) AND HIDES IT WITH ONE OF THE OTHER STUDENTS IN HIS/HER DESK. THEN THE WHOLE CLASS SINGS, "DOGGIE, DOGGIE, WHERE'S YOUR BONE? SOMEBODY'S GOT IT IN THEIR HOME." THE STUDENT IN THE FRONT OF THE ROOM WITH THE CLOSED EYES THEN STANDS UP AND TURNS AROUND. THE STUDENT GETS THREE GUESSES CONCERNING THE LOCATION OF THE BONE. IF THEY GUESS RIGHT, THEN THAT STUDENT COMES UP AND THE ORIGINAL STUDENT GOES BACK TO THEIR SEAT. THEN THE GAME STARTS AGAIN. IF THE STUDENT DOES NOT GUESS CORRECTLY, THEN THE 'BONE' IS SHOWN, AND THE GAME BEGINS ALL OVER WITH THE SAME STUDENT STILL HAVING TO CLOSE HIS EYES AND GUESSING AGAIN.
